## TELEGRAMS.

### ST. CROIX STATION.

Sofia, Jan. 16th.—The Bulgarian Government today received from the Allied Council of Ambassadors an order saying that Bulgaria must be completely disarmed. Within one month, says the order, the Bulgarian Government must dismiss its Gendarmes and frontier guards, leaving for these services only volunteers who number about 4,700. The Government replied it was impossible to execute the order without throwing the country into anarchy.

Dublin, Jan. 16th.—The King has sent the following message to Viscount Fitzalan, the Viceroy "I was gratified to hear from your telegram of the successful establishment of the provisional government of Ireland. I am confident that you will do everything in your power to help its members accomplish the task which lies before them."

London, Jan. 16th.—The War Office today issued an official announcement that the evacuation of Southern Ireland will commence forthwith. The battalions about to leave are named, and it is stated that other units will leave as rapidly as transportation and other conditions permit. Army stores are being moved concurrently with the troops.

Dublin, Jan. 16th.—The following statement was issued by the publicity department of the Mansion House today. "The members of the provisional Government of Ireland received the surrender of Dublin castle at 1.45 p. m. today. It is now in the hands of the Irish nation. For the next few days the functions of the existing departments of that institution will be continued without in any

way prejudicing future actions. Members of the Provisional Government will proceed to London immediately, to meet the British Cabinet Committee to arrive for the various details of handing over. A statement will be issued by the provisional government tomorrow in regard to its immediate intentions and policy. Signed Michael Collins, chairman.
