Lieutenant and Mrs. Roy E. Barrett have taken the house at No. 38 Strand Street, Christiansted, (until recently occupied by Mr. Thage), where they will be at home after Tuesday, May 29th.

At 9.30 a. m. on Memorial Day, May 30th, there will be a brief and simple ceremony on the water front near the Marine Barracks, St. Thomas, when a volley will be fired by the marines. At noon twenty one minute guns will be fired. The graves of the Navy dead in the Military and Western cemeteries in St. Thomas, and also at Frederiksted, St. Croix, will be decorated by flags and flowers by members of the Navy.
