at Tavoy, Lower Burma, says a message received here.

Paris, June 28th—Germany has been admitted to membership in the International Chamber of Commerce.

Cleveland, Ohio, July 1st.—The list of known dead in Northern Ohio tornado on Saturday has reached 98, with indications that this number probably will be increased. At Lorain where the storm hit the hardest, the death list stood at 7213 additional bodies having been recovered yesterday. Approximately 75 persons have been reported missing at Lorain. Conservative estimates place the property damage in Ohio at more than \$300,000,000. Governor Donahey, on his return to Columbus, called a meeting of State cabinet businessmen to discuss relief measures.

Washington, July 1st.—The indictments charging Albert Fall, former Secretary of the Interior, Harry Sinclair, Edward Doheny and Doheny Jr. with criminal action in connection with the leasing of naval oil reserves in Wyoming and California, were returned yesterday in the District of Columbia Supreme Court. A special Grand Jury which has given weeks to consideration of the evidence, levelled formal charges of felony against the four men whose names have held the spotlight in the prolonged Senate oil investigation and the civil litigation which followed.
