TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Washington April 13th.—House Democrats bound themselves through Caucus action today to stand against the Emergency Tariff and anti-dumping bill and representative Kitchin, minority leader, made public, simultaneously, a statement of views of the minority members of the Ways and Means Committee, bitterly assailing the Republican temporary tariff programme sharp differences arose in the Caucus on the question of instructing Democratic members to vote unreservedly against the emergency measure, but it finally was carried by a vote of 77 to 29. After the Caucus Mr. Kitchin predicted that "less than a dozen Democratic votes will be cast for the young bill". In the minority report the Republicans are accused of tossing into the lap of "three great trusts, \$775,000,000 a year", and of seeking to destroy future trade with the Central Powers and smaller states in Europe through "A subtle and dangerous joke", in directing the Secretary of the Treasury to fix the value of Foreign money as a basis for levying duties on imports. The present bill is characterized as even worse than its predecessors, the Fordney measure, by the report which asserts that if any advantage will ensue anywhere from the new proposal it will be to the trusts, speculators and profiteers. It also calls attention to provisions of the Republican National platform and inquires whether "Any honest republican can sincerely vote for this bill in the belief that it will reduce the cost of living."

Executive Order No. 20.

EXECUTIVE Order No 9, issued 24 January, 1920, requiring that bay rum shall be sold only on delivery of a permit issued by the Police Department, is so far modified that bay rum may be sold locally without permit from Police Department, provided that bay rum so sold without permit shall contain one of the modifying agents enumerated below; and provided further that the label on each bottle so sold without permit shall be so printed or stamped in red ink in as to indicate plainly the modifying agent and number of grains per ounce used.

The alternative modifying agents are:

Salicylic Acid	5 grains per fluid ounce.
Quinine Sulphate	2 grains " " "
Chinchonidine Sulphate	2 grains " " "
Resorcin	5 grains " " "

Bay rum which has not been modified by the use of one of the agents indicated above shall be sold locally only under permit issued by the Police Department as heretofore required.

The penalties provided by Ordinance approved 9 July, 1918, shall apply in cases of violations of this Order.
