PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)

Government Secretary (Zane) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. I understand that the motion made is to eliminate the last phrase of Section 2 of the resolution. I would like to offer an additional amendment that the first phrase be stricken out also, leaving only the first paragraph. In the past the procedure has been that when a Committee like this is formed, the Government has been called in as required to advise the Committee. I see no reason for deviating from such a procedure. If I am wrong on that I would like to be corrected.

District (Jessen) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. I am a comparatively new member of this Council and do not know much of what has happened in the past in this connection, but I propose that seven members be appointed by the Council, and that if Government so desires the Committee can be supplemented with three members elected by it.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. It seems to me after hearing the remarks of the Honorable 1st Member for Christiansted Country District that his views are exactly the same as Government has proposed. If I understand him correctly, the Government Secretary means that the Committee should go ahead and call in whatever members of the Government they deem necessary so that proper amendments can be made.

1st Member for Christiansted Country District (Jessen): Mr. Vice-Chairman. I agree with Government's proposal and recommend that the second paragraph of the resolution be struck out.

1st Appointed Member (Coulter) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. I sincerely hope that the Council will adopt this resolution and revise the regulations, particularly concerning motor traffic. Members are aware that this is the third attempt to revise the Police Regulations. In 1921 I introduced a similar resolution. The Committee was appointed, but did not work, and handed in no report. In 1923 I brought in another resolution and the Committee was appointed but no report has been received. I sincerely hope that the Honorable 1st Member for Christiansted Country District will have better luck than I have had. I heartily recommend to members to pass the resolution and appoint a committee and go to work quickly upon it.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. It was not my intention to speak today, but inasmuch as the Honorable 1st Appointed Member made reference to a Committee appointed some time ago to revise the Police Regulations I rise to say that I was a member of that Com-

mittee. The Honorable 2nd Appointed Member was also on the Committee and was appointed Chairman. I do not remember having been notified of any meeting called by the Chairman of that Committee. I remember the Honorable 2nd Appointed Member saying that he was in favor of incorporating the Police Regulations in the Code. I agree with the Honorable 1st Appointed Member that the Regulations need revising. I think they should be incorporated in the Code and penalties provided. The Honorable 1st Member for Frederiksted Town has introduced an ordinance providing for a Committee, to revise the Code of laws and which is now in Committee, the Police Regulations can be taken care of by that Committee.

1st Member for Frederiksted Town (Jackson) remarked: Mr. Vice-Chairman. The Honorable 3rd Member for Christiansted Town is under a wrong impression. The Police Regulations should not be incorporated in our Code. It is a matter that is drawn up by the Police Commission and sanctioned by Municipal Councils. However the Road Ordinance should be made a part and parcel of the Police Regulations since it is merely taking care of traffic on the roads. Be that as it may I was glad to hear the Honorable 1st Appointed Member say vehemently that the Police Regulations need revision. I was not going to speak on this matter, but since he has risen and said in vehement terms that it needs revision I agree with him and I urge that the work be commenced as quickly as possible. There is a number of cases before the Police Court every week and it is difficult at times to tell where we are. I remember a case in which the speed limit was fixed by the Director of Police at so many seconds from one point of the town to another. It was very interesting when a man said he had driven over a certain distance in so many seconds I asked him how he knew he said "We had to go out and measure." As the Director of Police has gone over this matter carefully, particularly as he has measured the distances from one street corner to another, I suggest that 1st appointed member be put on the committee so that he can give whatever data he has at his disposal.

The Vice Chairman: I have received the following amendment from the Honorable 1st Member for Christiansted Country District:
