Executive Order No. 2--1922.

WHEREAS, the present methods of slaughtering animals in the Virgin Islands for market purposes, are, in many instances unnecessarily cruel and inhumane; and

WHEREAS, the present method of tying animals in vehicles for transport to slaughter and for other purposes is likewise cruel and inhumane;

NOW THEREFORE, I, SUMNER E. W. KITTELLE, Governor of the Virgin Islands of the United States, do hereby direct that all animals must be quickly and humanely stunned before they are killed for the purposes above mentioned. And it is further directed that cruel methods of tying animals in vehicles for transport be not employed.

The Department of Police will have

jurisdiction in the enforcement of this Order.

Witness my hand and the Seal of the Government of the Virgin Islands of the United States this fifth day of May nineteen hundred and twenty two.
