ST. CROIX STATION.

Delayed In Transmission.

Zurich, May 22nd.—A wireless despatch from Moscow announces that the Soviet Govt. has sent the Allied Government a note protesting against the Polish offensive.

Paris, May 22nd.—The Federal Council of Railwaymen decided at a meeting this evening to continue the strike and declared that it will be supported by all the unions, in accordance with a decision of the national council. Notwithstanding an order by the railway union to continue the strike, numerous resurrections by strikers are being recorded, notably two thousand two hundred on the State system.

Paris, May 25th.—President Deschanel this afternoon spent a few moments in his office. A bulletin issued by his doctors at six-thirty p. m. stated that his condition was satisfactory and without feverish symptoms.

Paris, May 26th.—The "ECHO de Paris" states positively that the President must resign himself to a complete rest, which may be prolonged until far into the summer, all audiences being suspended. The "Petit Journal" states that there is no danger of complications, but rest is necessary. It is understood that the President will proceed to the estate of his father-in-law, near Rennes, where he will have the absolute quiet necessary.

Paris, May 26th.—The peace conference has invited the German Government to replace Colonel Xylander, its delegate to the Sarre Commission. The "Journal" however, says that the conference of ambassadors has demanded not only his recall, but his formal disavowal by the German Govt., the measure of which will mark its good faith.

Paris, May 26th.—M. Daniel Berthelot yesterday communicated to the Academy of Science an important discovery by Dr. Pech, ensuring protection for operators against the terrible effects of the X Ray. The procedure consists of the neutralization of the ultra violet rays by the simultaneous application of infra-red rays.

Paris, May 26th.—The conference of ambassadors this morning concluded its examination of the question of Slesvig. It then considered the utilization of the product of the sale of war material not destroyed, and the question will be regulated in agreement with the reparations commission.

Rome, May 26th.—The Italian aviator Ferrara, who is flying from Rome to Tokio, has arrived at Vitchou in Korea.

Paris, May 27th.—M. Millerand will reply on Friday in the Chamber of Deputies to questions relative to the fixing of the German indemnity, but with certain reserves, the negotiations at Hythe not having yet been approved by the Allies and Germany showing but little good will for adhering to the decision of the Entente.
