There is posted in the lobby of the Christiansted Post Office, a copy of a notice which is also being displayed at the Kingshill and Frederiksted offices, bringing to attention of whom it may concern that a vacancy exists in the position of Postmaster at Frederiksted, St. Croix, Virgin Islands, and will be filled by examination from the public.

Parties desiring to take the examination for this position should make application, in duplicate, to Post Office Inspector W. R. Ryan, San Juan, P. R., on or before the 20th. instant, upon the prescribed blanks which can be secured from the Postmasters at Frederiksted or Christiansted. The examination will be held at Frederiksted, probably within the next sixty days, and each applicant will be duly notified as to the exact date some days in advance. It is open to both sexes and will consist only of filling out certain blanks in the presence of the Inspector or his agent, and the writing of certain simple sums in addition and multiplication, together with a letter-writing test. No preparation, other than the submitting of the application blanks in duplicate, as above set forth, is necessary or advisable. Any person of ordinary intelligence and education should be able to pass the

mental examination, and applicants are requested to refrain from writing the Inspector for more detailed information as to the nature of the examination.

Applicants for the appointment as Postmaster at Frederiksted must be citizens of Saint Croix, and if not actually patrons of the Frederiksted Post Office must agree to establish their residence within the delivery of the office upon notice of their selection for appointment and before taking the oath of office. They must be at least 21 years of age, of good moral character, and able and willing to provide suitable quarters for the Post Office. The politics or religion of the applicant will not be considered, except that no one whose political activities might prove offensive to the patrons of the office will be appointed. No one who holds an elective political office will be appointed unless his application is accompanied by his signed statement, made before two reputable witnesses, to the effect that before taking the oath of office as Postmaster he will resign from all connection with such political office. No persons concerned in a contract for carrying the mails, either as contractor, subcontractor or surety, nor any member of his immediate family shall be appointed postmaster, and no person engaged in the prosecution of claims against the Government of the United States shall be appointed. APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED UNLESS SUBMITTED IN DUPLICATE IN THE APPLICANT'S OWN HANDWRITING.
