TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Buenos Aires, March 7th.—Louis Firpo tonight knocked out Erminio Spalla, the Italian heavyweight champion, in the 14th round of what was to have been a fifteen round bout.

Athens, March 7th.—The Cabinet of Premier Kafandaridis has resigned.

New York, March 7th.—A new low record of 36/8 cents for the French franc was quoted today in the local foreign exchange market. Yesterday's low record was 3.76½.

London, March 8th.—The resignation of King Hussein of the Hedjaz as Caliph by the Arabs of his Kingdom, as well as the Moslems in Mesopotamia and Trans-Jordania, which are ruled by his two sons, is regarded in London as the forerunner of a bitter contest among the Islamic countries for the mantle of the Prophet Mohammed. A split of the entire Oriental World and an unbridgeable schism in the Moslem Church are predicted.

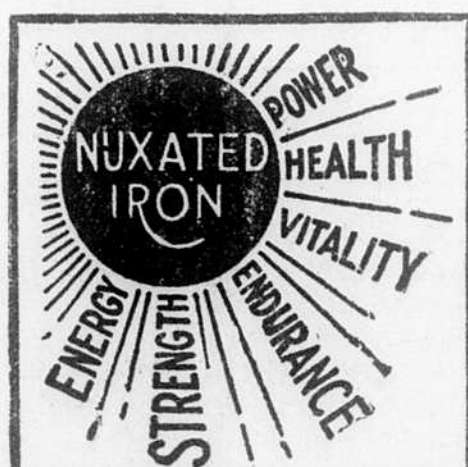
Paris, March 6th.—The Senate last night, by a show of hands, fixed upon Thursday March 13th for its next sitting, although it has been supposed it would accept the ultimatum of M. Poincare to the Senate Finance Committee that he and his Cabinet would resign unless the Government's financial measures were immediately discussed and approved. The action of the Senate thus raised anew the entire question surrounding the Government's fiscal measures. M. Poincare learned with surprise of the vote in the Senate as he was leaving the Chamber of Deputies. He immediately conferred with his colleagues and they decided that he should attend the meeting

of the Senate Finance Committee today as previously arranged. It is expected that he will then repeat his ultimatum.

Paris, March 8th.—M. Poincare yesterday challenged Deputy Delaunay to a duel, because of remarks made by the Deputy in the Chamber of Deputies. The seconds of the two men met later and decided that the remarks did not reflect on the honor of the Premier and that therefore a duel was not justified. The belief was expressed by the seconds that the principals would accept their conclusion.

Ottawa, March 8th.—Yesterday in Parliament Mr. Donald Sutherland, Conservative, South Oxford, moved an amendment to the address in reply to the speech from the Throne, deploring adverse conditions said to exist in agriculture and regretting that the speech from the Throne contains no promise of legislations which will tend to retain and enlarge the home market for Canadian produce. The adoption of the amendment would amount to a vote of non-confidence in the Government.

Wellington, N. Z. March 8th.—Large shipments of New Zealand apples are being made to London and Hull and also to South American ports. The fruit growers here anticipate that 250,000 cases of apples will be exported from New Zealand this season.
