PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)

Government Secretary (Gaffney): Mr. Vice-Chairman and Honorable Members. I take pleasure in introducing to you Lieutenant Commander William S. Zane, the Government Secretary to be. It would afford Commander Zane and the Government great pleasure if a more personal introduction is made.

The Vice-Chairman: On behalf of the Colonial Council of St. Croix, I extend a hearty welcome to the new Government Secretary.

The letter of appointment of the Honorable 1st Appointed Member (Coulter) was at this juncture produced.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata), after looking at the date of the letter of appointment, remarked: Mr. Vice Chairman. It is evident that the date in the appointment has been changed. That has been done. If the letter has been in the Colonial Council's Office all the while the change was made there; if it was taken out it was done outside.

1st Member for Frederiksted Town (Jackson) after examining the letter said: There has been a change made in the date of the Honorable 1st Appointed Member's appointment.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) Mr. Vice-Chairman. Would you find out from the Clerk of the Council whether or not the letter was at any time taken from the Colonial Council Office after it had been filed there.

The Vice-Chairman thereupon called upon the Clerk to explain and in reply said: The letter was taken from the Office by Mr. Coulter who requested me to loan it to him and was soon after brought back to the Office by him.
