Mrs. James Sanford Thomas wife of one of the employees of the Municipal Telephone System died in this town following a short illness, on Thursday night and was buried by Rev. W. Mrs. Mathilda Cooper, an old and respectable resident of Christiansted died here late Friday and was laid to rest on Saturday, funeral to the Anglican Church conducted by the Rev. H. M. Pigott.

Hewitt, leading butcher, and grocer of that town for many years, and a respectable citizen who will be greatly missed in his home where he has left a widow and children and in the community where through an amiable disposition coupled with tact that secured him popularity among all classes, he was a veritable landmark. Our sympathy is extended to those thus sadly bereaved.

LOCAL

The mail steamer "Romanita" made the usual call at this port on Saturday, returning to San Juan, P. R. via St. Thomas from Frederiksted yesterday.

Our popular Dr. Canegata was hastily

summoned to Butcher O. C. Hewitt early last Saturday morning and reached the bedside with all speed, but the patient was unfortunately already beyond human aid.

There will be a meeting of the Colonial Council today, the agenda of which is chiefly the examination of patents of election and appointment of new members, two of whom have not previously occupied seats in the Council, and the election of officers for the Council and the different public commissions. The assembly will sit at least one member short through the resignation of elected member for Frederiksted Country District G. B. Fleming.

The Holy Cross (R. C.) Church observed its yearly Corpus Christi festival yesterday with the customary impressive and picturesque procession through the town. The Native Brass Band was in attendance, but as many persons did not march as is usual. A light shower interrupted the procession at the corner of our office but otherwise fair weather prevailed.
