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PRESIDENT TO MAKE FOURTEEN SPEECHES.

Alaska Trip, Which Will End With a Touch of the Tropics to Start June 20.

SAILS FOR ALASKA JULY 6

Expected Here not Later Than Middle of August; Will Speak on World Court and Domestic Affairs.

President Harding's Alaskan trip, which will end with a touch of the Tropics with his visit to the Canal Zone and Porto Rico, will commence Wednesday, June 20, when the President leaves for St. Louis where he will make the first of fourteen speeches in the middle West and West.

While no date has been fixed definitely for his visit here it probably will not be later than the middle of August.

Elaborate preparations are being made for the President's trip across the continent. A special Pullman car is being fitted out for his use and it will be provided with a powerful wireless broadcaster so that while he is speaking from the observation platform he may be heard all over the country. The radio will be one of the most powerful sets ever placed aboard a car.

The President will make two speeches in Missouri, at St. Louis and at Kansas City. He will then go to Hutchinson, Kansas; Denver, Cheyenne, Wyoming; Salt Lake City, Pocatello, and Idaho Falls, Idaho; Butte and Helena, Montana; and Spokane and Tacoma, Washington. He will sail for Alaska July 6.
