## TELEGRAMS.

### ST. CROIX STATION.

Lythem, Eng., June 1st.—Gene. Sarazen and Walter Hagen finished first and second in the Northern Professional Golf Association's championship tournament, which ended here today, with scores of 290 and 292 respectively for the 72 holes. H. A. Gaudin, the young Jersey player, broke the course record with a 67 in the third round, thereby winning a special prize of 100 pounds. W. A. Stil tied for third place with Tot Walton, the local professional their scores being 293. Joe Kirkwood the Australian was ninth with 300. James Barnes was twelfth.

Berlin, June 1st.—German army officers representing 100,000 members of a reactionary group in convention here, yesterday solemnly pledged themselves to work for "strengthening the Fatherland" and significantly declared "the day of freedom is not far distant." This is translated to mean they will strive for a restoration of the Monarchy. Meantime the senate of the free city of Hamburg had forbidden monarchist organizations to stage celebrations on Thursday on the anniversary of the battle of the Skaggerak, holding that to do so would endanger the public safety, in view of the troublous situation. At Magdeburg the marine league celebrated the Skaggerak, speakers demanding that the nation "awake", so that Germany no longer be "slave folk as since the war."

Dusseldorf, June 2nd.—The main railway, used by the French for the transportation of coal and coke out of the occupied Ruhr district, was cut early today by the explosion of bombs. Both tracks were torn up for a considerable
