The Congressional Committee were entertained at dinner last night by Mr. Robt. L. Merwin in Frederiksted, the members of the Colonial Council being among the guests invited to meet the gentlemen.

The Vixen arrived here this morning with the Congressional Committee which reached Frederiksted Saturday night on the Dolphin and motored to this town yesterday morning returning again to Frederiksted where the party transferred to the Vixen. The postmaster regrets exceedingly that certain patrons of the post office were disappointed because there was no general delivery last night of the mail which arrived here at 6 p. m., the non-delivery not being due to any desire to adhere

rigidly to the letter of the Postal Regulations which make no provision for delivery of mail on Sunday except the public convenience requires it and the mail arrives before 6 p. m. Experience has shown that owing to the systematic disorder which prevails in the lobby as a rule, night deliveries are impracticable and should be attempted only when really necessary. Part from this the office should be opened at least one hour for general delivery which did not seem warranted last night when the outgoing mail having been already dispatched the chief advantage of distribution to enable reply was thereby debarred. To avoid misunderstanding and disappointment no general delivery should be looked for, when the incoming mail arrives after the outgoing, or later than 6 p. m., Sunday.
