FROM THE POLICE.

ALL owners of dogs are enjoined with in the ending of January month to procure from the Police Office (for Kingshill District from Kingshill Police Station) the signs for dogs prescribed by the Police Regulations, which according to same must always be worn by the dog, and for which Franes 10.00 must be paid for the dogs in town and Franes 2.00 for those in the country.

After said time dogs not wearing the sign for 1922 will be caught and brought to the Police Office (Kingshill Police Station) and detained for 3 times 24 hours, when it will be killed, unless the owner appears to claim the dog, pays a fine of Franes 15.00, and eventually procure the required sign.

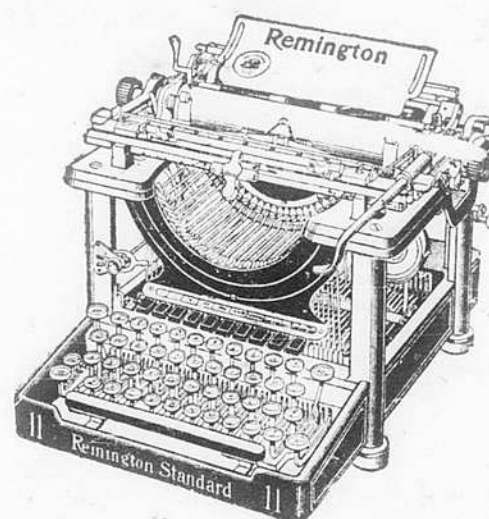
FROM THE POLICE.

It is hereby made known that the Horse, Carriage and Boat Tax for the first half year 1922 will be received by the Director of Police in Christiansted and Frederiksted from the 20th January 1922 to the 10th February 1922, both days included, after which the list of arrears will be transmitted to the same authority for further measures.

Each debtor of tax will be subject to a fine of Franes. 1.00 if the tax be under Franes. 25.00 and Franes. 2.00 if the tax be Franes. 25.00 or above, beside the ordinary levy expenses.
