PROPOSED BY: Senator Vargrave A. Richards, by Request of the Governor

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has invited the Government of the Virgin Islands to apply for \$2,194,000 from the HUD Secretary's 2000 Discretionary Fund; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to reprogram a total of \$262,941.91 from the 1992, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998 and 1999 Community Development Block Grants which were previously approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

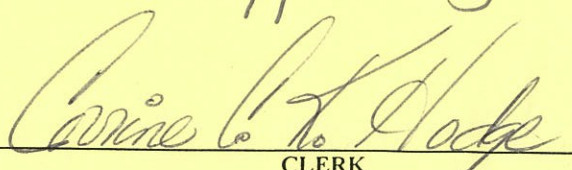
