PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)

The Chairman would like to ask members to confine themselves to the Rules of Business while the bill is under 2nd Discussion.

The Chairman: I will place the proposal of 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District before the House, and I wish to remind members that this draft has already been to a committee.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) in reply to the Chairman said,—this Draft of Ordinance has never been placed before a committee.

The Chairman put the member's proposal to the vote.

4 members voted for; 8 against. One member not voting.

The Chairman remarked: The member's proposal falls to the ground.

The Chairman put to the vote the motion made by 2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) that 2nd Discussion be deferred so as to allow him time to bring in an amendment to the bill.

5 members voted for; 6 against.

The Chairman then put to the vote the motion made by 2nd Appointed Member

(Noll) that 2nd Discussion be closed.

6 members voted for; 4 against.

2nd Discussion closed.

The Chairman asked the Secretary to the Council to read the bill.

The Secretary (Canegata) asked to be relieved as he was not feeling well.

Accordingly the Assistant Secretary (Robt. W. Skeoch) took the Chair.

The Chairman remarked: I will put to the vote whether 2nd Discussion should be closed.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata): That is unnecessary. The motion proposed by the 2nd Appointed Member (Noll) has been carried. Therefore 2nd Discussion is closed.

The Chairman put to the vote whether 3rd Discussion should come on today.

8 Members voted for; 4 against.

The Chairman remarked: 3rd Discussion will come on at the next meeting of the Council.

The Chairman then gave a recess of 20 minutes.

1st Member for Christiansted Town (Abramson), 2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) and 3rd Member for said Town (Alexander) left the meeting during the recess.

After recess the Council reassembled and the Chairman remarked: Owing to the fact that there is not a quorum, we are unable to transact any business, consequently the next item on the order of the day will have to go over. According to Par. 4 of the Rules of Business I have to announce that Government has called an extraordinary meeting of the Council for next Monday, the 18th inst., at one o'clock p. m.

There being no further business before the House the Chairman declared the meeting closed at 3 p. m.
