FROM THE POLICE.

THE attention of all owners and drivers of vehicles in the Island of St. Croix is hereby called to the observance of, and compliance with, Paragraph 27 of the Police Regulations for St. Croix of 30th January 1915 and the Supplementary Regulations thereto of 24th February 1915—viz—

Paragraph 7.

"All vehicles when in use between the hours of sunset and sunrise shall be provided with a lighted lantern on either side, or at least in front on the right side".

Supplementary Regulations.

"For all automobiles, a distinguishing letter and number shall be prescribed by the Police, and no automobile must be used upon public roads without being provided with two signboards, one in front and one at the back of the car, containing these distinguishing signs, easy to be read at a distance of 75 feet".

"When in use between sunset and sunrise, the automobiles must be provided with a lighted lantern which clearly illuminates the hind signboard.

Cricket.

The cricket match which was played on the Holger Danske Ground on Thursday the 12th inst. between Brun Picked Eleven C. C. and Finlay Picked Eleven C. C. resulted in a victory for Brun. P. E. C. C. which scored 118 runs in the two innings, and Finlay P. E. C. C. 108 in its two innings.

When Brun side went to bat in the second inning Harold Williams, after batting for about $\frac{1}{2}$ of an hour scored 24 runs. Harry Edwards 6, Lewis Meyers 4, George Nugent 1, Ivan James 6, Peter Jackson 9, and Leuben Brun after batting for an hour or more made 38 and retired from the wickets, with four more men to bat who were V. Simmonds, C. Messer, H. Seeley and P. Hendricks.

Brun's Club made 31 in the first innings, and 87 in the second. Finlay's Club 29 in the first innings and 79 in the second.

The game started about 11.30 a. m. and came to a close about 4.30 p. m.

Persons who were interested in the game came down on the Ground to witness the match and everything went on in a peaceable way and the boys came to town.

I must need say that Finlay's Boys showed great playing but Brun's Boys over-
