The Chairman remarked: My reason of placing the majority first is that the minority is purely a negative proposal, and according to definite parliamentary rules you cannot amend an amendment with a purely negative proposal.

1st Member for Christiansted Country District (*Stakemann*) remarked: Mr. Chairman. It seems to me that the majority of the Committee are all merchants, and those on the minority are not merchants. I do not see what objection the latter could have to add these items on the list, the only reason could be to protect the merchants, but if these recommend the additional articles, I fail to see why they should not be put on the list.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (*Canegata*) remarked: Mr. Chairman.

I have stated my reason, and I doubt very much if all the merchants will agree to have the items recommended by the majority put on the list.

1st Member for Christiansted town (*Abramson*) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I do not agree with the last Honorable Speaker. The hucksters are not allowed to import, they buy from the merchants who are importing, and they should have the right to sell the class of goods recommended by the majority. Many of the huckster's who had a hucksters license has so helped themselves that they were able to buy a Burgher Brief License.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (*Canegata*): Then it is not necessary to have huckster's license.

1st Member for Christiansted Town: Yes we need them.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (*Andersen*) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I have not looked into this matter very carefully, but as far as I can see it would be beneficial to the Community if all canned goods could be sold by the hucksters. The more the
