VIRGIN ISLANDS OF THE UNITED STATES
ST. THOMAS.

Executive Order No. 4--1922.

Municipal physicians and all officers in the United States Medical Services on duty in the Virgin Islands may engage

in private practice in addition to their regular assigned duties, provided the following requirements are strictly complied with.

1. Such private practice must in no way interfere with an officer's paramount duty, which in the case of a municipal physician consists in giving medical and surgical attendance to the indigent sick in municipal hospitals and

through such out-of-hospital services as are established.

2. All local laws relating to licensing and registering of physicians must be observed before engaging in private practice.

3. Property belonging to the Federal or Colonial Governments shall not be used in private practice. However, should occasion arise a private patient may be admitted to a municipal hospital, with the consent of the Chief Municipal Physician, provided the regular hospital charges for maintenance are paid into the Colonial Treasury.

4. All charges for private medical and surgical services must be moderate. It is not practicable to establish a fixed rate of charge for professional services, but in case of complaint of excessive charges, the Governor through the Medical Aide will require the physician against whom such complaint is made to show cause why his local license should not be revoked.

Item 10.

Colonial Council Bill No. 18.

Continuation of 1st Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 18, Draft of an Ordinance introduced by 4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) amending Title II, Chapters 29 and 31 of an Ordinance providing a Compiled Code of General and Special Laws for St. Croix, etc. with amendment.

Despatching Secretary (Rappolee) remarked: Mr. Chairman. The Ordinance, as originally introduced, did away with entire Chapter, or was not clear in what it would do, and Government proposed the first amendment, but later on, upon certain things being pointed out to it.
