According to a telegram published in this issue from St. Thomas reports the destruction by fire on the morning of the 15th. inst. of the Bornn's bay rum store room. Some stock is said to have been saved, but particulars are scanty.

### TELEGRAMS.

#### ST. CROIX STATION.

Paris, June 12th.—The Conference of Ambassadors, presided over by M. Cambon, considered a report on the negotiations which are proceeding in Paris between Poland and Germany. It approved of the plan of the Supreme Council concerning rolling material in Europe and examined a request by Greece for admission to the Danube Commissions.

Paris, June 12th.—The London correspondent of the "Temps" telegraphs that the situation regarding the mission of M. Krassin become difficult if the Soviet persists in making no reply to the terms formulated by Mr. Lloyd George on the 31st May.

Rome, June 12th.—Advices from Avlona report that the Italian troops have evacuated Montenegrin territory.

Trieste, June 12th.—Violent demonstrations have occurred here in protest against the sending of troops into Albania.

Cairo, June 12th.—An attempt against the life of the President of the Council was made today by bombs, which however failed in their object. Three persons were wounded.

Berlin, June 12th.—Herr Muller has declined to form a Cabinet, in consequence of a check by the Independents. President Ebert has summoned Herr

Heinze a Moderate Conservative, to undertake the task.

Paris, June 12th.—The "Petit Journal" states that the decrease in the tourist traffic in Switzerland is causing a marked reduction in all branches of business and an important diminution in exports.

Paris, June 12th.—The Press unanimously state that the climax of the high cost of living in France has been passed and that a decline in the prices of food and live stock is general throughout France, especially in the South East.

Rome, June 12th.—The Albanians on the sixth instant began isolated actions in the regions of Janina and Tepelini, where the Italian garrisons offered a desperate resistance, giving way only to superior numbers. A detachment at Giorni capitulate, but the other garrisons delivered violent counter-attacks the Alpini, in extricating the front towards Avlona, surrendering from a heavy rear fire. The Italian inhabitants of Avlona, having arrested and deported a thousand Albanians, the Albanians in reprisal shot their Italian prisoners.

Trieste June, 13th.—Quiet has been restored here and the reinforcements for Albania have embarked without further incident.

Paris, June 13th.—General Essad Pasha Head of the Albanian delegation in Paris, shortly after leaving his hotel was confronted on the street by a young man who fired two shots from a revolver into his chest, the General collapsed & was taken to his room, where he died shortly after. The murderer was arrested by a waiter of the hotel & was taken before the Police, where he was found to be an Albanian subject, named Rustem Avez who had arrived in Paris on the 31st. May to study teaching. He declared that he had not premeditated the crime, but recognizing the Albanian Dictator, & finding himself in his presence, he acted spontaneously, provoked by the sufferings that Essad Pasha had brought upon Albania.

Rouen, June 13th.—Great celebrations in honour of Joan of Arc commenced here today, amid popular rejoicings, the City being gaily decorated. The British & Belgian Govts., upon the invitation of France, are participating officially in the fetes.

Rome, June 13th.—The "Epoca" learns that in consequence of Commissariat difficulties the Italian garrison at Tepelini was compelled to surrender to the insurgents.

Berlin, June 13th.—President Ebert has issued a decree raising the state of Siege in the Ruhr Basin from the 17th. inst. and also in Silesia.

Paris, June 13th.—Advices from Berlin state that owing to opposition by the Majority Socialists, Herr Heinze has abandoned the task of forming a new Cabinet.

Paris June, 13th.—In connection with

a report published by a Japanese paper announcing a counter-revolution in Russia, officials declare that no confirmation of this has been received. It is however stated in official circles that since the 11th instant the French wireless stations have been receiving from Moscow only incomprehensible radio messages, and that last evening only indecipherable messages in Russian were received.

Saint Thomas, June 15th.—A fire occurred early this morning, destroying the building used as the storeroom of the Bay Rum Establishment of Messrs. D. O. Bornn & Sons. In the building were stored casks of Bay Rum and alcohol etc. valued at several hundred dollars. Both the building and stock were covered by insurance.
