FIND RUINS OF ANCIENT TIBERUS.

While engaged on a Government road near Tiberias, Sea of Galilee, Jewish workmen found part of an old wall and columns which are believed to have belonged to Tiberius, the ancient city named in honour of Tiberius Caesar.
