today at an Easter mass meeting held in advocacy of disarmament, under the auspices of the womens disarmament committee. Senator Borah of Idaho, who was the principal speaker, again advocated an agreement between the United States, Great Britain and Japan to reduce naval armaments, and charged the authors of the programme for increased armaments for the world with being "sedulous patrons of Bolshevism, painstaking and industrious gardeners of unrest and misery". The meeting, it was announced, was held simultaneously with others in 15 states in the interests of reduced naval and military programmes.

Berlin, March 27th.—Belief that the immediate danger of a coordinated general strike in the Central German industrial regions has been temporarily banished, is expressed by Government leaders here. They take this view because of the Easter holidays, which have come at the critical period, in the governments view. In the meantime, faith is pinned to the ability of the 5,000 Prussian security police to stamp out the lawlessness still rampant in open stretches of the country between towns. Many of these districts were, up to last night, firmly in the grip of bands of communists, who were everywhere leaving behind blown up public and private buildings and railway bridges and looted shops. Reports were received that the rioters were fortifying themselves in hilly districts Eisleben, Mansfeld and Hettstadt are guarded by security and local police, but the situation at Leuna has not yet been cleared up. The big nitrogen plant there has been made the headquarters of the communists and leaders are said to be directing operations from factory buildings. Government officials appear confident that working men will reject the idea of a general strike, into which they say the communists are now attempting to bludgeon them through terror. The radical publication, the "Red Flag" printed last night a manifesto demanding that workers everywhere strike in support of the revolt in Central Germany. The court-house at Mansfeld as well as the railway station at Hettstadt, has been wrecked by dynamite, but advices received in this city indicate that the rioters suffered very heavy casualties in the clash with security police.
