Sir:

In accordance with the recommendation submitted by the Export Tariff Commission, composed of yourself as Chairman and Messrs. R. L. Merwin, F. Andersen, A. Lang, C. V. F. Daniel as members, which Commission met at Frederiksted, 23 December, 1920, the Governor approves the valuations and directs that the export duties be collected beginning 6.00 a. m., 1 January, 1921 as follows:

some illegal rum-selling, at Estate Mary's Fancy, on Xmas Day, and Anduze is alleged to have left to report the matter at Ki gshill Police Station. Evidently he was followed and, as is understood, an unequal conflict ensued on the public road somewhere between Estates Barren Spot and Bonne Esperance. Anduze was killed and his body carried some distance in the adjoining canepiece and abandoned there. When located by direction of the prisoner, the remains found were but parts of a skeleton scattered about here and there, the flesh having been, as is supposed, devoured by dogs. The skull disclosed a fracture believed to have been caused by a blow. The skeleton was brought to town at 1.30 p. m. yesterday by the Hospital Ambulance and was greeted by an enormous, and justly indignant crowd which would not have handled the perpetrator of this shocking crime with silken gloves. In recording this sad event which is one of the most dastardly misdeeds in the annals of the history of this island, much sympathy is felt for Mr. Gregorio Anduze the father of the murdered young man, and our sincere sympathy is extended to him and the brother of the deceased.

It is requested announced that the remains will be laid to rest this afternoon, funeral from the hospital at 4.30.
