advantageous terms possible, provided that there shall be set aside such sums in the annual budgets for this Municipality as will redeem the full amount for this issue, and provided further that a sum not exceeding one per centum of the amount of the bonds herein authorized is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pay the flotation charge of preparing, advertising and issuing the same.

Section III. PROVIDED FURTHER:— That there shall be available for this purpose from the Immigration Fund Frcs: 375 000 or so much thereof as may be necessary after the Funds in Section I and II have been expended, provided further that reimbursement to the Immigration Fund shall be as set forth in the following section.

Section IV. TO PROVIDE for the maintenance, repair and upkeep of this highway and to assist in providing funds for the redemption or purchase of obligations to the Municipal Treasury and the Immigration Fund in Section II and III, there shall be levied, assessed and collected by the Government, from and after January 1, 1922, the following annual fees:

- (a) For passenger carrying automobiles not exceeding 2200 lbs. weight..... Frcs: 100.00.
- (b) For passenger carrying automobiles from 2200 to 3000 lbs. weight..... Frcs: 125.00.
- (c) For passenger carrying automobiles above 3000 lbs. weight.. Frcs: 175.00.
- (d) For auto trucks or other

freight vehicles not exceeding 3000 lbs..... Frcs: 125.00.

- (e) For auto Trucks or other freight vehicles above 3000 lbs..... Frcs: 250.00.
- For auto truck trailers per ton capacity per trailer..... Frcs: 50.00.
- (f) For all animal drawn vehicles..... Frcs: 10.00.

In default of payment of this tax within ninety days after notice, the unlicensed vehicle may be seized and sold at public auction, the proceeds to be returned to the former owner after deduction of the tax and all costs. No part of this tax shall be applicable to Government owned and operated vehicles.

All laws and part of laws in so far as they conflict herewith are hereby repealed

LOCAL.

The U. S. N. tug Tadoussac called at Frederiksted Thursday afternoon and brought the St. Thomas mails.

The Creole arrived Thursday evening and will not return in the mail service again this week we are advised.

The Virginia with States mail arrived at Frederiksted this a. m.

The Guiana homeward bound is expected Monday morning (28th) and we are informed that all mail for the States will be forwarded by her, instead of via Porto Rico.

All passengers for St. Thomas and New York must secure their tickets by 5 p. m. to-day.

The mail-contractor, Mr. J. Alexander, has received a new Ford truck for transporting mail. It is a roomy conveyance with a carrying capacity of a ton, and will thus enable the forwarding of all dispatches, in more or less one trip.

It being understood that the only trouble with lighting the bandstand was the lack of 110 volt bulbs of which a supply has now been installed, the public is looking forward to a Sunday evening concert for tomorrow. It is several months since this entertainment has been afforded.

TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, March 21st.—Mr. Austin Chamberlain, the newly elected leader of the House of Commons and leader of the Unionist party in the House of Commons was received with loud coalition cheers when he entered the House this afternoon. His first duty as leader of the House was to answer 'yes' to a question as to whether the Govt. would hold and maintain a controlling interest in the Anglo-Persian Oil Co. after the issues of the new capital was completed. In reply to congratulations on his new position, Mr. Chamberlain said he would do his best to maintain the traditions of the House. Regarding the election of Mr. Churchill as leader of the Unionist party in the House of Commons, it is a political tradition that a man cannot be a leader of the whole party unless he has been a Prime Minister. In ordinary party Government the Prime Minister would be leader of the whole party, but the coalition complicates matters. Mr. Lloyd George is theoretically a liberal and therefore cannot be leader of the Unionists in the House of Lords and the question of leadership of the whole party remains undecided.

Camden, N. J. March 22nd.—The super dreadnought Colorado was launched here today at the yards of the New York Ship-building Company with her sister ship the Maryland. The new vessels will rank as the most powerful of the United States war craft.

Miami, Fla. March 22nd.—Mr. Wm. Jennings Bryan was asked last night by the Y. M. C. A. of Miami to run for President in 1924. "With the women voting I am confident I would be elected should I try", he replied.

London, March 22nd.—The German reparation bill imposing a levy of 50% on the value of all German imports to be used toward payment of reparations today passed all the remaining stages in the House of Lords without discussion. The measure now needs only the King's assent to become law.

London, March 22nd.—Details of an entirely new type of seaplane, which can either fly, or cruise as a warship, have been made public here. Two of these ships are being built for the air ministry. The vessels are said to be much like small ships with wings added. They are larger and stronger than any seagoing aircraft yet constructed, and each will carry a crew of seven, with emplacements for five machine guns. The vessels are so constructed that the hulls are sufficiently seaworthy to ride out the roughest waves. They will be capable of co-operating with the navy and joining in all manoeuvres, without a parent vessel, operating from a sea base, just as the submarine does. They have a range of 1,500 miles and when not flying will be able to "taxi" along the water, driven by their propellers.
