MR. D. HAMILTON JACKSON ADDRESSED A GATHERING IN SUNDAY MARKET LAST NIGHT and dealt with the question of the form of government suitable and desired in these islands representing it as that the oppressors of the people favored a retention of the present form which he strangely enough complimented in many respects. The speaker agreed that the sponsors for the present form of government are correct in saying that the colony cannot bear its own expenses even now, but expects that the same aid the Federal Government is now extending will be continued. He did not know whether or not the \$200,000 a year granted us was

absolutely necessary but he thought we had the same right to look for it under a changed administration. The weather which had been rainy all day interrupted the meeting which was dispersed by a shower just after 8.30.

West End News is exultant over the fact that the Congressional Commission will land at Frederiksted, and essays to condole with this city that our telegram has probably been delayed. The visit of Commission to this island is expected to bring us help. First impressions go a long way, and if the deputation catches its first glimpse of us at Frederiksted we may feel sure they will be impressed that we need help, and give it to us.
