PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

The Chairman then brought up item 1 of the order of the Day.

Item 1.

Colonial Council Bill No 11.

Introduction of and 1st discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 11, draft of an ordinance introduced by Government concerning insanity law.

Government Secretary (Gaffney) in introducing the bill said, Mr. Chairman. Printed copies of this ordinance have been transmitted to the Council to place before each member. It has been discovered in the first enactment clause that the primary purpose was to insert this law as now drafted into the Code, but now it is deemed advisable to change this method and enact it as a separate law. It is hoped that the Council in passing upon it will make the necessary change. The act itself is self-explanatory and in strict accordance with law.

3rd Appointed Member (Armstrong) would like to know whether this draft of ordinance has been passed by the St. Thomas Council?

Government Secretary (Gaffney) in reply said,—It is under discussion there.

5th Appointed member (McIntosh) proposed that the ordinance be sent to a committee of 5 members.

The Chairman: Before putting the question—If it is decided to send the bill to a committee it would be necessary to elect that committee after recess. This is the last meeting in the elective period, and it is the custom to reintroduce all matters pending on the Council's Docket in the new Council. With that in view is it advisable to send the bill to a committee? Wouldn't it be better to let it go over on first discussion and the Government Secretary can reintroduce it?

2nd Appointed Member (Nell) proposed that there be no discussion on the bill.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) would like to know whether Government intends to call an extraordinary meeting before the expiration of the term.

Government Secretary (Gaffney) It is entirely possible.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: In accordance with what the Government Secretary has just elucidated I think the motion of the 5th Appointed Member is in order.

Couldn't we appoint a committee from the members who we know will remain in the Council?

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata): You cannot expect 9 members to legislate for the Council while the other 9 members keep quiet.

2nd Appointed Member (Nell) withdrew his motion.

The Chairman remarked: I think the best solution is to discuss the matter and let it go over on first discussion.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) proposed that the ordinance go to a committee of five members.

3rd Member for Frederiksted Country District (M. M. Skeoch): Suppose the members appointed on the Committee are not reelected to the Council, what would happen?

The Chairman: Then don't do it. In general practice committees are appointed under 2nd Discussion, not first discussion. We get into the habit of appointing committees under first discussion, that's not quite proper. I think the best thing to do is to let the matter go over on 1st Discussion.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Chairman. While that is true, so far, there is every likelihood of the Government calling an
