PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)

After recess the Council reassembled and the Chairman brought up item 3 of the Order of the Day.

Item 3.

Colonial Council Bill No. 59
Introduction of and 1st Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 59, draft of an Ordinance, introduced by Government, providing for collection on merchandise remaining in the Customs warehouses etc.

Red Cross Membership Posters.

Colonial Council Bill No. 59.

2nd Council, 2nd Session 1920—1921.

ORDINANCE.

Be it enacted by the Colonial Council for the Municipality for St. Croix:

That on merchandise remaining in the Customs warehouses at either Christiansted or Frederiksted, for a period of more than fourteen days, there shall be levied and collected a charge of fifty bit per cubic foot for each thirty day period or fractional part thereof; that such charges shall be collected as other customs charges; and that the moneys so received shall be accounted for in the same manner as other Customs charges collected.

Proposed by Government.

Government Secretary (Timmons) in introducing the ordinance said,—Mr. Chairman. The bill proposed by Government for warehouse charges is merely to make the charges uniform. Since the proposal of this ordinance by Government the question has been raised as to

what the charge should be, and Government learns that Members think that the rate is high. It was proposed by some one who has a good knowledge; however if Members care to amend the ordinance they are at liberty to do so.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) would like to know whether the amount stated in the ordinance will be in addition to the present charge?

Government Secretary (Timmons) answered: To take the place of it.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Chairman. This would make the charges pretty high for the people of Christiansted. I propose that Frederiksted have the same charge existing in Christiansted.

Government Secretary (Timmons) remarked: Mr. Chairman. It is the understanding of Government in fixing this rate it would expedite the removal of goods in storage. I have no knowledge of the proper charge, if the charge is too low it would not facilitate the removal of goods in the warehouses.

1st Member for Christiansted Town (Abramson) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I for one would like to know where is the warehouse in Frederiksted? For over twenty or thirty years past the King's Wharf in Frederiksted is used as a warehouse. It would be a good thing if Government would erect a proper warehouse in Frederiksted. I am here to represent the people and it is my duty to draw attention to such matters. The warehouse at this end is fairly good, but could be made larger; if the Government would build proper warehouses a proper charge could be made for goods remaining there. It is unfortunate that this matter is brought up on the eve of His Excellency's departure, or else he would have looked in to the matter and he would see that there is great need for a warehouse in Frederiksted.

1st Member for Christiansted Town (Coulter): Do I understand that the Honorable Secretary to the Council has proposed an amendment to the ordinance?

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata): Yes, I have proposed an amendment, and if I am permitted I can write it out right here.

The Chairman remarked: The amendment can be brought in at 2nd Discussion.

1st Discussion closed.

COMMITTEE REPORT

on Resolution Re Revision of Hucksters List.

The Committee appointed in the Colonial Council in its meeting held on February 14, 1921, to revise the list of hucksters goods in
