January 13th.

The Colonial Council for St. Thomas and St. John yesterday (Thursday) afternoon passed the tax ordinance for that Municipality, including all American features of taxation of real and personal property. The ordinance is considered a

creditable piece of work in every way. The Colonial Council is to be congratulated upon the enactment of legislation of so vital importance to the welfare of those two islands. The Colonial Council of St. Croix is working on the proposed tax ordinance for this island, and in due course St. Croix will not be behind its sister islands in a plan of taxation along American lines.

TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

San Juan, Nicaragua, Jan. 10th — The volcano Ometepe on the island of Ometepe eight miles from the Western shore of lake Nicaragua is in active eruption. Many thousand of cocoa plants have been destroyed. Large areas of grazing lands are covered with ashes, and many cattle are dead. The inhabitants of the adjacent villages are fleeing to zones of safety. The eruption is the worst since 1885.

Messina, Sicily, Jan. 10th. — A tremendous landslide yesterday destroyed the cathedral, the post office and many dwellings in the town of Sanfratello. The entire population retired to the country. The slides are continuing and much damage is being done to the remaining buildings. No details have been reported.

London, Jan. 10th — Organized labour in Ireland will soon make an important announcement in favour of the peace treaty. The attitude of labour hitherto has been regarded as uncertain, and supporters of the treaty expressed gratification on learning of the impending declaration.

Belgrade, Jan. 10th. — The engagement of King Alexander to the Princess Marie, second daughter of King Ferdinand and Queen Marie of Rumania, was officially announced today. Princess Marie is 22 years of age. She was reported engaged to King Alexander, who was then Prince Regent of Jugo-Slavia, in September, 1920.

New York, Jan. 10th. — The raw sugar market was steady and unchanged at 1.15/16 cents for Cuba's, cost and freight, equal to 3.54 for centrifugal. Trading in raw sugar futures were fairly active, and prices after declining 1 to 3 points, and trade selling, rallied on covering and buying by Wall Street interests. The market for refined was un-
