ST. CROIX STATION.

London, June 27th.—Dr. Guest, Labour member of the House of Commons, has been chosen British Ambassador to Soviet Russia, according to the Daily Mail. Guest was Secretary and physician to the Labour delegation of Soviet Russia in 1920.

London, June 27th.—United Press. The different interpretations by the French and British newspapers on the results of the conversations that took place last Sunday at Chequers Court between Mr. MacDonald and M. Herriot have been cleared up and it is believed that the removal of certain misunderstandings will lead to a better understanding of French and British differences. Mr. MacDonald's absolute denial of the existence of any "pact" has relieved British anxiety, which was caused by growing suspicions of the French Militaristic Party. The country is utterly behind the Premier's determination to pursue a policy of forced German disarmament. The greatest satisfaction is expressed over the decision of the United States to take part in the conference. There is a growing belief also that the Dominions should be represented although not formally members of the conference. The possibility that the Dominions may be invited to send observers is being widely canvassed.
