ALL Road holders are hereby notified, that, all boundary-posts which should have been planted on the day of assignment, and which are still conspicuously absent, must be planted within 8 days from date of this notice. There are still a few, and those responsible are reminded of section 25 of the Road Ordinance of 1923.

All are also requested to commence the annual repairs, especially in the matter of the ditches, which in many places are choked by mud and debris brought down by the late rains. Holes in the road should be immediately filled, and the branches of trees which hang low over the road, should be cut away. Where culverts are choked, they should be immediately cleared.
