

Resolution.

Be it enacted by the Colonial Council for St. Croix in Session assembled:

The Governor is hereby authorized to renew the sum of Frs. 25,000 from the Reserve Fund, to be deposited in the Colonial Treasury and to be applied in acceptance with the terms of Colonial Council Bill No. 12, 2nd Session 1919-1920.

That the loan thus authorized is to be secured by a mortgage bond to bear no interest.

That the building acquired in accordance with the terms of Colonial Council Bill No. 12, 2nd Session 1919-1920 is to be rented for the sum of Frs. 125 per month, such rentals to be deposited in a redemption Fund to be known as the "Frederiksted High School Redemption Fund", there to remain so deposited until such deposits equal the amount of the mortgage bond, when the total amount shall be deposited in the Colonial Treasury and applied in satisfying the mortgage held in the Reserve Fund.

Thus duly passed at the 3rd Ordinary Meeting of the Colonial Council held Monday, October 20, 1919.
