JAPAN, the leader of the East, intellectually and industrially, with a modern army and Navy and a militaristic spirit based on German principles, frankly irreligious, and without respect for women.

CHINA, a nation ignorant of surgery and sanitation, with only one hospital in an area as large as the U. S. east of the Mississippi.
