FROM THE POLICE.

THE attention of all owners and drivers of vehicles in the Island of St. Croix is hereby called to the observance of, and compliance with, Paragraph 27 of the Police Regulations for St. Croix of 30th January 1915 and the Supplementary Regulations thereto of 24th February 1915--viz--

Paragraph 7.

"All vehicles when in use between the hours of sunset and sunrise shall be provided with a lighted lantern on either side, or at least in front on the right side".

Supplementary Regulations.

"For all automobiles, a distinguishing letter and number shall be prescribed by the Police, and no automobile must be used upon public roads without being provided with two signboards, one in front and one at the back of the car, containing these distinguishing signs, easy to be read at a distance of 75 feet".

"When in use between sunset and sunrise, the automobiles must be provided with a lighted lantern which clearly illuminates the hind signboard.
