EDITORIAL.

Although late by a couple of days we wish to extend our congratulations to our esteemed fellow townsman Mr. Henrik Larsen, Dannebrogsmænd, and former Inspector of the Frederiksted Hospital on his completion on the 10th instant of 51 years of residence in these islands, to which he arrived in the year 1870, in the colonial military service in which he served 2 years in Frederiksted, subsequently filling positions as jailer, etc., on the police force at Kingshill, and St. Thomas, ultimately returning to Frederiksted where he has made his home since 1877. During the Danish administration there were fewer officers on the police force, and the rank of police-sergeant (overpolice) was represented only at Christiansted, Kingshill, and St. Thomas. Nevertheless such a position was created and conferred on our old friend at

Frederiksted for long and faithful service, as well as through his having declined offers of the same position at Kingshill. In 1907 Mr. Larsen left the police force and accepted the position as Inspector of the Hospital which post he filled until some time after the change of flag. During that incumbency the King of Denmark decorated him with the order of Dannebrogsmænd, and that and a valuable gold souvenir medal presented by the Police Force in Frederiksted when he completed 25 years connection with the force, are among marks of the regard he won in public service. It is our hope that although he has filled the so-styled "allotted three score and ten" he will be spared in health for years to come.
