alists have decided to evacuate Angora their Capital and retire on Caesarea, according to a despatch from Constantinople.

Eureka Cal., Aug. 8th. —Passenger and members of the crew of the steamer “Alaska” were blown from the decks of the vessel into the ocean when the ship's boilers exploded as the “Alaska” started sinking after twice hitting on Blunts Reef on Saturday night, survivors numbering 166 persons brought here said last night. Forty-eight persons, thirty-six passengers and twelve of the crew were lost. The steamer Alaska belonged to the San Francisco and Portland Steamship Company, was south bound from Portland, and Oregon to San Francisco. Captain Hobey, master of the Alaska, is still unaccounted for, and is believed to have gone down with his vessel.

London, Aug. 8th. —Mr. Hughes, Premier of Australia, on Saturday unveiled a bronze statue of Mr. Lloyd George at Carnarvon, Wales. Mr. Hughes said the statue, which was the gift of the Mayor of the City, enshrined the spirit and genius of the Welsh race. The statue was nine feet high and depicts the Premier in characteristic oratorical attitude with uplifted hand. There are two panels on the pedestal, representing the peace conference at Versailles and the other the School at Llanystymday where Mr. Lloyd George was educated.
