Dear Sir:—

I am pleased to see that a Public Meeting has been called to consider the question of one or two judges for these islands, a question which is of vital importance to the people, as the matter also involves the question of an Appeal Court in the Virgin Islands as recommended by the Congressional Committee, and I therefore beg to recommend that the inhabitants attend as largely as possible in order to support the recommendations of the Congressional Committee and in protest of the actions taken by the Colonial Council in the matter, against the wishes of the People.

TELEGRAMS

ST. CROIX STATION.

(Delayed in transmission.)

Minneapolis, May 6th.—Flour made new high records here today with an advance of fifty cents per barrel. An advance yesterday in wheat, with a good steady demand, is the reason ascribed for the increase in today's quotation.

London, May 7th.—Great Britain is on the eve of negotiations with Soviet Russia, a Moscow wireless message today asserts, in order that definite negotiations may be begun concerning the cessation of the Bolshevik advance in the
