garded as the weak point, when he asked what was likely to happen in the almost inevitable event of France refusing to assent to the proposed reply to Germany. He referred to rumours during the last day or two of the more amendable disposition of the Poincare Government, and asked whether there was any foundation for the rumours. The Prime Minister statement evidently was designed to refrain from any language which might needlessly alarm or offend the French. Viscount Grey in the House of Lords, also emphasized in the strongest language the expediency of preserving the Anglo-French Entente.

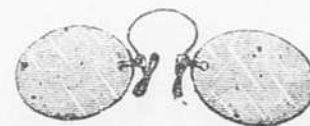
