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Bolshevist Commander in southern Russia, had encircled a Bolshevik Corps consisting of eighteen regiments on which the Wrangel forces concentrated a fire from armoured cars and airplanes. The message declares only 150 of the Bolsheviks escaped 1,000 prisoners being captured and the battlefield left covered with dead. In addition 49 guns were captured. The message adds that a second Bolshevik cavalry corps with its staff was also captured by Wrangel's army.

Paris, July 6th.—The Paris newspapers express satisfaction today that the Allied representatives at Spa refused the demand of Herr Fehrenbach, the German Chancellor that economic questions be considered before disarmament. They believe the German move was premeditated and say it constituted a blunder which strengthened the Allies' hands. The "Echo De Paris" expresses the belief that the conference will last about fifteen days.

St. Johns, N. F., July 6th. Preparations are being made at Signal Hill for the coming demonstration of the scientific wonder of the age, namely the speaking from the oldest colony to the mother country by telephone. The object is to have the steamer "Victorian," on which the British Press Delegation are coming across in constant communication with the land on the other side, from the day they leave Liverpool till they arrive at Halifax. English engineers are now here erecting the plant.

Warsaw, July 7th.—Along a front of approximately 720 miles, the Russian Bolsheviks launched the greatest offensive they have ever hurled against the Polish lines. On the northern and southern flanks the Poles are retiring in the face of superior enemy numbers, the attack on the northern sector being the most severe of the struggle on the fronts. Faced with the necessity of shortening their line, the Poles have withdrawn at all points.

London, July 7th.—The Fortress of Rovno, one of the famous triangle fortresses in Volhynia, has fallen into Bolshevik hands. They took 1,000 prisoners, 2 armoured trains, 2 tanks, 2 6-inch guns and a train.

Spa, July 7th.—A decision was reached by members of the German Ministry and military officers, attached to the German delegation here this morning to recommend to Herr Fehrenbach, head of the German delegation, that a plan of disarmament for Germany be presented to the Allies representatives this afternoon. The conference therefore will continue.

London, July 7th.—Major Hardcastle, late of the Royal Artillery, won the Edge Competition at Bisley, with a score of 140. Maurice Blood was second with 139. Major Ranken, the famous Bisley shot, won the Bass Match after the shooting.
