that he was unable to obtain the n. The despatch adds that it is reported that D'Annunzio has sent a battalion to Zara. The cause of the trouble is not indicated in the despatch.

Lismore, Ireland, June 29th.—Several private houses and places of business here were sacked on Sunday by soldiers in reprisal for the kidnapping of Brigadier General Lucas on Saturday night. There was some firing in the streets but nobody was killed.

Dublin, June 29th.—The utmost endeavours have been made by military patrols, aviators and the police to trace the whereabouts of Brigadier Genl. Lucas. Up to last evening, however, all efforts had failed.

London June 29th.—It was announced in the House of Commons last night that no information had been received respecting General Lucas who had been captured by the Sinn Feiners. Mr. Lloyd George said that martial law had not been proclaimed in any part of Ireland.

Stockholm, June 28th.—All the war prisoners on board a Bolshevik steamer which sank recently in the Neva river were saved, according to a despatch to the "Dagblad" from Helsingfors, Finland.

London, June 29th.—The positions taken by the Greeks in the advance against the Turkish Nationalists from Smyrna in Asia Minor, are being consolidated and the forward movement has been stopped to permit of this process, it is announced in advices from Smyrna.

London, June 29th.—Lord Milner, presiding at a farewell luncheon to Mr. Arthur Robinson, the Attorney General of Victoria, Australia, stated that the proposal would be submitted next year to the Imperial Conference for the submission of functions in the Colonial Office by the transfer of the control of matters relating to the Dominions from the Colonial Secretary to some other authority. The matter had been under consideration but no decision had been taken upon it until it had been submitted to an

Imperial Conference, dealing with constitutional relations in different parts of the empire.

San Francisco, June 29th.—Open warfare over prohibition and the Irish question and other troublesome issues of the Democratic platform began today in a storm swept committee hearing, while in private the leaders continued their negotiations for settlement to keep the hostilities from spreading later to the floor of the convention. Tonight the platform sub-committee had not yet begun actual preparation of the party's declaration of principles and there were no surface indications that their task had been made any simpler by the day's public arguments or private consultations.
