London, Aug. 25th.—As generally expected, the bye-election yesterday in the constituency of Caerphilly, in the mining districts of Wales, resulted in the return of Mr. Morgan Jones. (Labourite), whose vote was 13,699, as compared with 8,958 for Mr. Edwards, (Liberal) and 2,592 for Mr. Robert Stewart, (Communist). The only question in regard to the voting was as to how far the vote for Stewart would split with that for Jones to the benefit of the Liberal candidate. The bye-election in Caerphilly was made necessary by the death of Mr. Alfred Onions, (Labourite), who, in the last general elections was elected by a vote of 11,496, against Mr. Edmonds vote 9,482.

London, Aug. 25th.—A Reuter despatch from Paris states that the French Federations has accepted an invitation of the Australian and New Zealand rugby union to send a representative team in 1922 to play a series of International games in Australia. The team sails next May. The French union is now in communication with Ceylon and South Africa, with a view to arranging matches in these countries on the outward voyage. On the return journey the team will cross Canada and will probably play a series of games in that country.

Washington, Aug. 25th.—Expressions of deep regret were voiced by Government officials without exception yesterday over the total destruction of the giant airship ZR-2, with a heavy loss of United States and British lives. Pride in the acquisition of the new "Queen of the air" and hopes of a tremendous development in military and commercial aeronautics, had lent interest to the plan for trans-Atlantic flight of the British-built air-cruiser, even beyond that which it would normally have aroused. Secretary Denby immediately forwarded to the British air ministry a message expressing the sympathy of the navy department. "The navy department of the United States extends to the air ministry of the British navy deep sympathy in the appalling disaster to the ZR-2", the message also said "we hope our early reports will prove exaggerated as to the loss of life." Far from being discouraged by the disaster, naval aviation officials are immediately prepared to seek authority for constructing a new airship of the ZR-2 type in the United States.

New York, Aug. 25th.—There was no change in raw sugar early today. Outside sugars were quoted at 4.50 for centrifugal, while the Cuban quotation was 3½ cents, cost and freight, equal to 4.86 for centrifugal. Trading in raw sugar futures was very quiet. Prices at midday were one point lower, to three net higher. In refined one local refiner reduced list prices to the basis of 5.85 for fine granulated, for hard grades. Prices now range from 5.80 to 6.00.

Berlin, Aug. 25th.—The treaty of peace between Germany and the United States was signed here at five o'clock this evening.

Dublin, Aug. 25th.—Viscount Fitzalan, Lord Lieutenant and Governor-General of Ireland, was summoned to London tonight to confer with the cabinet.

London, Aug. 25th.—The air ministry today summoned a court to investigate the wreck of the ZR 2. It will sit at Howden at ten o'clock on Saturday morning. The air Vice Marshall, Sir John Salmon, will preside. The United States Naval attache has been invited to attend and has consented to send a representative to sit on the court.

Berlin, Aug. 25th.—Great looked coldly on while thousands of soldiers, who fought during the great war, marched before General Ludendorff, Prince Eitel Frederick, Count Von Waldersee and General Von de Goltz at the old Berlin stadium yesterday. The lack of enthusiasm among the spectators was notable, only a few persons uncovering when "Die Wacht Am Rhein" was played by a veteran band. A message from former Emperor William, couched in the bombastic language he at one time indulged in was read. "With pride and warm gratitude I think today of my brave comrades, never vanquished in the field," it said, "with true German loyalty they achieved deeds such as history never has known before. The heroism of the dead will live on unforgotten, to the honourable memory of the dead and for the imitation of the living and future generations. May the halo of the great days of the past be the beacon for victorious illumination still in the dark future. God protect the fatherland and its people." Count Von Waldersee was the principal speaker at the demonstration, which was characterized by Radicals was a monarchist attempt to revise the dying war spirit. And for the enactment of legislation

that would abolish the private line guard system in the state. His address was fiery in character, the old military chieftain declaring "there will come again a day when we will stand guard in Germany. We must train our children to use the rifle and sword. So long as Germany suffers under a foreign yoke and the French stand guard on the Rhine we must prepare for revenge". The Government had forbidden officers and soldiers in the Government service to participate, and had scattered scores of security police throughout the crowd in anticipation of disorders. Field Marshal von Hindenburg, who sponsored the demonstration, telegraphed his regrets that he could not attend.
