## PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

*(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)*

Election of an Assistant Secretary.

15 voting tickets were handed in.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) received 4 votes. 4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) and 5th Appointed Member (McIntosh) received 3 votes respectively. 3rd Member for Frederiksted Country District (M. M. Skeoch) and 4th Member for said District (Andersen) received 2 votes respectively and 1st Member for Frederiksted Town (Jackson) received 1 vote.

As none had absolute majority vote a new vote was taken.

14 voting tickets were handed in, or was blank.

3rd Member for Frederiksted Country District (M. M. Skeoch) received 5 votes, 3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) and 5th Appointed Member (McIntosh) received 4 votes each.

As none had absolute majority vote a new vote had to be taken.

16 voting tickets were handed in.

3rd Member for Frederiksted Country District (M. M. Skeoch) and 5th Appointed Member (McIntosh) received 7 votes each and 3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) received 2 votes.

None of them having received absolute majority vote 5th Appointed Member (McIntosh) was, by virtue of Paragraph 19 of the Rules of Business, declared Assistant Secretary to the Council.

Item 3.

Election of Members of the Municipal Committee and Substitutes.

The election took place in this manner: Two names were written on the voting tickets, the first name signified the member of the Committee and the second name the substitute.

For an Appointed Member.

16 voting tickets were handed in.

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) received 7 votes as member and 4 votes as substitute. 5th Appointed Member (McIntosh) received 5 votes as member and 2 votes as substitute, and 2nd Appointed Member (Noll) received 4 votes as member and 3rd Appointed Member

(Armstrong) received 10 votes as substitute.

The *Chairman* marked: 3rd Appointed Member (Armstrong) having received 10 votes is elected as substitute, and as none of the others has received absolute majority vote a new vote will be taken for a member.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata): Mr. Chairman you cannot do that. If you declare the Honorable 3rd Appointed Member elected as substitute, you would be depriving him of his right to be elected as member.

A new free vote for member and substitute was ordered and 16 voting tickets were handed in.

Elected were: 4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) as member with 11 votes and 3rd Appointed Member (Armstrong) with 13 votes as substitute.

5th Appointed Member (McIntosh) received 2 votes as member and 2 votes as substitute, 3rd Appointed Member (Armstrong) received 2 votes as member, 1st Appointed Member (Coulter) 1 vote as member and 2nd Appointed Member (Noll) 1 vote as substitute.

For Christiansted Town:

16 voting tickets were handed in.

Elected were: 2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) with 15 votes as member and 1st Member for said Town (Abramson) with 14 votes as substitute.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) received 1 vote as member and 2 votes as substitute.

For Christiansted Country District:

15 voting tickets were handed in, one was void.

Elected were: 3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) with 12 votes as member and 1st Member for said District (Jessen) with 12 votes as substitute.

Member for Christiansted Country District (Jessen) received 2 votes as member and 2nd Member for said District (Berg) received 2 votes as substitute.

For Frederiksted Town:

14 voting tickets were handed in.

1st Member for Frederiksted Town (Jackson) and 2nd Member for said Town (Merwin) received 7 votes as member and 7 votes as substitute each.

As there was a tie vote between the two members a new vote had to be taken.

15 voting tickets were handed in, one was void.

Elected were: 2nd Member for Frederiksted Town (Merwin) with 9 votes as member and 1st Member for said Town (Jackson) with 8 votes as substitute.

2nd Member for Frederiksted Town (Merwin) received 6 votes as substitute and 1st Member for said Town (Jackson) received 5 votes as member.

For Frederiksted Country District:

15 voting tickets were handed in, one was void.

Elected was 4th Member for Frederik-

sted Country District (Andersen) with 12 votes as member.

2nd Member for Frederiksted Country District (Curry) received 7 votes and 3rd Member for said District (M. M. Skeoch) received 6 votes as substitute.

As neither of the substitutes had absolute majority vote a new vote had to be taken.

16 voting tickets were handed in.

Elected was 2nd Member for Frederiksted Country District (Curry) with 9 votes.

3rd Member for said District (M. M. Skeoch) received 7 votes.

Item 4.

Election of a Chaplain.

13 voting tickets were handed in.

Elected was Rev. Francis W. Clair with 8 votes.

Rev. Scott received 3 votes and Rev. Pedersen, Rev. Pigott and Adjutant Bishop received 1 vote respectively.

### TELEGRAMS.

#### ST. CROIX STATION.

Berlin, June 7th—Seven were killed and more than 100 wounded in disorders at Leipsic, it is announced. The dead include one policeman and there are 16 policemen among the wounded. 38 of the wounded are in a serious condition. The demonstration was in protest against the Ruhr occupation and the insufficiency of the unemployment doles. Some 20,000 persons, it is said, took part. The demonstrators gathered under the auspices of the trade unionists and the socialists in five huge assemblies in the central part of the town. The demonstration was the climax of a number of minor parades and open air meetings which had occurred during the two days previous. Towards the close of these gatherings, it is stated, crowds of the youthful unruly elements suspected of including some communists, be-
