TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Belfast, Oct. 24th—The international soccer football match played on Saturday between England and Ireland, resulted in a tie, with the score one goal each.

Halifax, N. S. Oct. 24th—The international fishing schooner race today was won by the "Blue Nose," of the Nova Scotia fleet.

Buda Pest, Oct. 24th—Ex Emperor Charles and ex-Empress Zita were captured today, near Komorn and are now confined in the castle at Patatovoros, guarded by two companies of Govt.'s troops. The troops covering the retreat of the former rulers were forced to surrender and are prisoners.

London, Oct. 24th—The Allied Govts remain firmly opposed to the restoration to the Hungarian throne of any member of the Hapsburg dynasty, declared Mr. Lloyd George in the House of Commons, today adding that the Hungarian Govt. had informed the Allies that the necessary steps would be taken to insure the removal of the ex-Emperor Charles from the country.

London, Oct. 24th—A Reuter's despatch from Buda Pest says that Count Andarassy has been arrested and that warrants for the arrest of Rakovsk, Leharado and other Carlist leaders have been issued.

New York, Oct. 24th—Three armed bandits in an automobile forced the driver of a mail truck to stop at Lower Broadway late tonight, while they rifled the truck of four pouches of registered mails valued at one million dollars by the postal authorities.
