To All Who May Be Concerned.

SECTION 256 of the Income Tax Law requires "That all individuals, corporations, or partnerships, in whatever capacity acting, including lessees or mortgagors of real or personal property, fiduciaries, and employers, making payment to another individual, corporation, or partnership, of interest, rent, salaries, wages, premiums, annuities, compensations, remunerations, emoluments, or other fixed or determinable gains, profits, and income of \$1,000 or more during any taxable year * * * shall render a true and accurate return * * * setting forth the amount of such gains, profits, and income, and the name and address of the recipient of such payment."

Employers in St. Croix, who come within the scope of the above provision of the law, will submit the necessary reports to the Despatching Secretary, not later than April, 15, 1922, on forms to be had at the office of the Despatching Secretary or at the office of the Director of Police in Frederiksted.
