Santiago, Chile, Nov. 20th.—Shocks continued last night at Vallenar and the neighbourhood, bringing down many walls in the stricken towns. According to reports from medical officers, 395 bodies have been identified so far, and they believe many more will be found. The damages caused to agricultural products in the earthquake district will, it is estimated, amount to twenty per cent of the present harvest.

Dublin, Nov. 18th.—At the conclusion of the Dail meeting last evening, the Labourites asked for an explanation of the execution of the four civilians, declaring that unless details were forthcoming, it would provoke feeling throughout the country against the Government. EXCHANGE OR PAYMENT OF 1918 WAR SAVINGS CERTIFICATES AT MATURITY.

War savings certificates, series of 1918, will mature January 1, 1923, and will be payable after that date at \$5 for each certificate affixed. It is important that owners of 1918 certificates desiring prompt payment or exchange at maturity shall be served with the least possible delay and confusion, and to this end the attention of holders is invited to the requirement that ten days' written notice shall be given in all cases, and will be required unless surplus funds are immediately available without embarrassment to the finances of the post office. Until December 31, 1922, owners may apply to exchange the whole or a part of their 1918 war savings certificates at maturity value for Treasury savings certificates to be dated January 1, 1923, with the difference either way to be paid in cash, or they may apply for full cash payment to be made at maturity. This information is furnished by the postmaster at Christiansted and further detailed advices on the subject may be obtained at his office.

San Francisco, Nov. 19th.—A radio message picked up at the Santiago station of the Naval Wireless system and delayed here, purporting to come from Hilo, told of an earthquake and tidal wave there. Tonight efforts to communicate with the Hilo radio station operated by a private concern were later unsuccessful, but radio men declared that it was not usual for that station to communicate direct with the mainland station.

London, Nov. 19th.—The Marquis of Crewe has been appointed as Ambassador to France in succession to Lord Hardinge who is retiring from the Diplomatic Service.

Brussels, Nov. 19th.—Cardinal Mercier, Primate of Belgium, is ill, suffering from a bad case of influenza, which in itself is not considered by the attending physicians as alarming, but there is some fear of complications, which, on account of the age of the Primate, might give the case a more serious turn.

London, Nov. 19th.—The following is the final summary of the election results: Conservatives 346, Labour 142, Liberals 62, Georgians 48 and others 17, total of 615.
