TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

New York, April 6th.—Raw sugar was 13/4 C. lower today, the Committee quoting Cuba's at 5 C. Cost and Freight, equal to 6.02 for Centrifugal. There were sales of about 15,000 bags of Sandomingo's and the Committee reported sales of two cargoes to local refiners. The market for refined was quiet at 8 C. for fine granulated. Sugar Future ruled lower under increased commission house and trade selling prices at midday were 5 to 10 points lower.

London, April 6th.—(By Canadian Associated Press) The Newbury race meeting has been abandoned for the present owing to the coal strike.

Naples, April 6th.—Mount Vesuvius in active eruption. The eruption is the most violent that has occurred in fifteen years. It is being accompanied by impressive internal rumblings. Dense clouds of smoke mixed with the flames, formed a majestic but alarming picture many tourists have been attracted by the spectacle, prevented from approaching the crater by the showers of hot ashes and cinders, and the movement of molten lava.

London, April 6th.—The Prime Minister tonight invited the executive Committee of the Miners Federation to meet him early Thursday Morning to discuss the coal strike situation.

London, April 6th.—A day of great excitement, which looked as though it were leading to an amicable negotiations to find an issue to the wage dispute in the coal crisis, closed with still another hitch owing to insistence on the part of the Govt. that resumption of the pumping at the mines,
