## TELEGRAMS.

### ST. CROIX STATION.

London, Feby. 27th. —On a virtual eve of the Allied Conference with the Germans on the reparation and disarmament question, the two principal Allied military chiefs, Marshal Foch and Field Marshal Sir Henry Wilson, spent the weekend by invitation with Mr. Lloyd George and M. Briand in their seclusion at Chequer's Court, the new country Home of the Prime Minister. The purpose of the consultation was to reduce the definite form the various proposals for the application of military and economic pressure sufficient to change the mind of Germany, should her Govt. refuse the reparations terms of the Allies. This subject has been meditated upon deeply by both the French and British General Staffs, and especially in Paris, for several months past, and the present was by no means the first exchange of views between the two, as to what action could be taken and effectively continued, for months, or even years, to compel Germany to meet what are considered her obligations. The Foreign Exchange market was in a state of deadlock, that conditions being attributed by dealers to the uncertainty in connection with next week's conference in London.

New York, Feby. 27th. —Federal prohibition agents raided sixty-four cafes and cabarets, many of them in the white light districts, yesterday, taking more than 1,400 prisoners and seizing a large quantity of alcoholic beverages, the raids, which began simultaneously at three o'clock in the afternoon, extended over a period of five hours, and included places in Manhattan, Brooklyn, and

Staten Island. The raiders, about fifty in number, were brought to New York, from Boston, Philadelphia and New Jersey cities for this particular raid. All the newspapers have carried accounts of their presence and purpose here, the first of these being printed several days ago. Among the well-known places raided, were Thomas Herdy's restaurant at Columbus Ave and 66th Street, the Moulin Rouge, West 48th Street, the Marlborough Grill at Broadway and 46th and the Strand Roof at Broadway and 47th St. The prisoners were proprietors and employees of the raided establishments where liquor was found.

Constantinople, Feb. 28th—Hostilities between the Russian Bolshevik and the Turkish forces for the possession of Batum are declared to be imminent. Ten thousand Turkish soldiers are on the outskirts.
