ST. CROIX STATION.

Florence, Sept. 9th—A dozen additional shocks have been felt in the afflicted district since the first one, further increasing the terror of the population. Up to six o'clock last night the number of dead reported was 527 although this is only approximate, for there are many bodies under the ruins. The injured are filling all the neighbouring hospitals. In nearly three score towns and villages serious damage was done and a total population of more than 10,000 rendered homeless. Barco, a town of 9,000 inhabitants, was virtually destroyed as was also Fernaci nearby.

London, Sept. 9th.—Guarantees that attacks upon the police in Ireland must cease are necessary before the Govt. can consider the liberation of Mr. MacSweeney and other hunger strikers, says the "London Times" in discussing Mr. Lloyd George's views on the subject as outlined in his interview at Viego, Switzerland, on Tuesday. "The policy of leniency has been tried three times already", says the newspaper, "After the Easter rebellion, October 1916, a large number of prisoners were unconditionally released, and twice since then the same thing has been done. The very men let out of prison at once engaged in fresh conspiracies, and started murdering the police in Ireland all over again." The newspaper declares the Government must either protect the forces in Ireland, or withdraw them altogether.

Rome, Sept. 9th.—The Pope has interceded in behalf of Mr. MacSweeney, according to the "Giornale d'Italia".

Tullow, Ireland, Sept. 9th—Armed and masked men attacked four police officers here last evening. Two of the constables were shot dead and another seriously wounded.
