France and Belgium will be extended to all the Allies, as otherwise the financial reform of Germany is impossible. When the occupation of the Ruhr took place in January Germany announced a stoppage of her reparations shipments of coal and other material to France and

Belgium, the occupying powers. She has kept up however certain shipments of commodities, such as coal, on reparation account to other of the Allies, including Italy. It is presumably to the stoppage of these reparation contributions that the agency despatch refers.
