Colonial Council Bill No. 21.
Continuation of 2nd Discussion on
Colonial Council Bill No. 21, draft
of an Ordinance introduced by Gov-
ernment providing for the protection
of wild birds and deer, with Commit-
tee Report.

COMMITTEE REPORT

On Colonial Council Bill No 21.

The Committee appointed by the
Colonial Council of St Croix to re-
port on Colonial Council Bill No. 21
recommends that the present Or-
dinance before the Council be with-
drawn and the following substitut-
ed:

ORDINANCE

for the protection of Wild Birds, Deer,
Female-Turtles, Turtle-Eggs, and Fe-
male Lobsters.

Be it enacted by the Colonial
Council for the Municipality of St.
Croix.

Sect. 1.

Wild birds in this municipality
are hereby divided into three classes
as follows (and specified below)
Class A., Class B. and Class C.
Any person who knowingly or wil-
fully kills, wounds or takes any wild
bird specified in Class A. or takes,
removes, injures or destroys any
nest or egg of any such wild bird
or exposes for sale or knowingly
or wilfully has in his possession
any such wild bird or any part of
such wild bird killed, wounded or
taken, or the nest or eggs of any
such bird taken in this municipali-
ty, or who exports or attempts to
export the skin or plumage or the
nest or eggs of any such bird shall
be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sect. 2.

Any person who between Febru-
ary first and July fifteenth know-
ingly or wilfully kills, wounds or
takes any wild bird specified below
in Class B., or takes, removes, in-
jures or destroys any nest or egg
of such bird, or knowingly or wil-
fully has in his possession, or ex-
poses or offers for sale or purchases
any such bird killed, wounded or
taken or the nest or egg of any
such bird during the dates speci-
fied, which shall be known as the
close season, shall be guilty of a
misdemeanor.

Sect. 3.

Birds as specified below in Class
C. require no protection under this
ordinance and therefore can be des-
troyed any time.

Sect. 4.

Any person who between Janu-
ary first and June thirtieth know-
ingly or wilfully kills, wounds or
takes deer or fawns, or knowingly
or wilfully exposes or offers for
sale or purchases such animal or
animals, or any part of such animal
or animals, killed, wounded or
taken, within the dates above speci-
fied, which shall be known as the
